Highlights regenerative, natural, and organic farming systems, biodiversity conservation, sustainable pest management, and financial mechanisms supporting eco-friendly agriculture.
- 4. Dryland and Rainfed Agriculture for Tackling Desertification and Droughts.**
Focuses on drought-resilient farming systems, stress-tolerant crops, soil moisture conservation, and innovative practices for improving productivity in dryland and rainfed regions.
- 5. Frontier Technologies in Land Resource Management for Viksit Bharat.**
Explores the application of AI, remote sensing, GIS, drones, precision agriculture, and digital technologies for efficient and sustainable land resource management.
- 6. Indian Knowledge Systems, Community Participation and Gender Neutrality.**
Emphasizes the integration of traditional knowledge with modern science, community participation, inclusive development, and gender-sensitive approaches in natural resource management.
- 7. One Health: Integrating Soil, Water, Environment, Animal & Human Well-being.**
Promotes interdisciplinary approaches linking soil, water, environmental quality, animal health, and human well-being for sustainable ecosystem management.
- 8. Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Partnerships for Achieving Viksit Bharat 2047.**
Focuses on innovation, entrepreneurship, public-private partnerships, and sustainable business models that strengthen resilient agro-ecosystems and rural development.
- 9. Plant Breeding, Biotechnology, and Genetic Resources for Resilient Agro-Ecosystems.**
Highlights crop improvement through breeding, biotechnology, genomics, gene editing, biofortification, and conservation of plant genetic resources.
- 10. Farm Mechanization for Effective Resource Conservation.**
Covers modern farm mechanization, precision equipment, conservation agriculture technologies, and resource-efficient machinery for sustainable farming systems.

Call for Papers

- **Format:** Times New Roman, 12 pt, double spacing, 2.5 cm margins, should include Title, Authors, affiliations, abstract and keywords (3-5).
- Papers will be reviewed for **Oral/Poster Presentation**
- **Awards** for Best Paper & Poster in each theme
- Interested participants can submit full papers (once their abstracts are accepted) to be published in **Journal of Soil and Water Conservation, India (NAAS rating 5.51)**. Full papers will be peer reviewed as per Journals' policies and only quality papers approved by reviewers will be published. These should be **Original research articles**.

Registration Fee

Registration fee include the conference kit, access to conference sessions, daily working lunches and specified dinners. The research fellows/students are required to produce a valid Identity card/certificate for availing the concessional registration fee. Please note that the registration fee does not include accommodation. HOW TO REACH FATEHPUR-SHEKHAWATI

Fatehpur-Shekhawati is strategically located on National Highway (NH)-52, midway between Jaipur and Bikaner, and enjoys excellent connectivity by both road and rail. The town is conveniently accessible from several major cities, with approximate distances as follows:

Jaipur – 165 km

Bikaner – 165 km

Sikar – 45 km

Churu – 40 km



The nearest railway stations are located at Fatehpur-Shekhawati, Sikar and Churu, providing convenient rail connectivity to major destinations.



Regular bus services connect Fatehpur-Shekhawati with Jaipur, Delhi, Hisar, and Sri Ganganagar, ensuring easy road access for visitors.



The nearest airports are Jaipur International Airport (180 km) and Bikaner Airport (180 km).



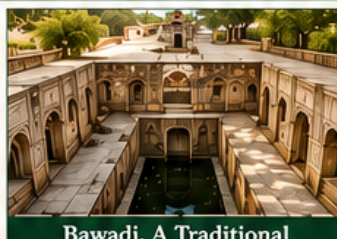

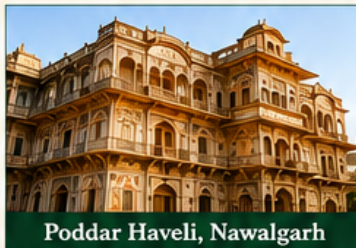
